## **1. Tiger Marching Band Philosophy**

The Wheaton Warrenville South High School Tiger Marching Band (TMB) is a musically and athletically challenging activity where young people can express themselves through the art of musical performance. You can expect that your student will achieve significant personal growth in the following areas: 1) musicianship, 2) social, emotional, and intellectual development, 3) teamwork, 4) individual work ethic, 5) personal responsibility, 6) self esteem, 7) self discipline, 8) school spirit and pride, 9) time management, 10) physical coordination and fitness and 11) lifelong friendships.

## **2. Membership**

- A. Any student eligible to enroll at Wheaton-Warrenville South High School is eligible for membership in the TMB provided they have a minimum of instrumental music education on a band/percussion instrument. (Preferably 2-3 years.) Students who study piano are also eligible for membership in the marching band. All TMB students are encouraged to enroll in the curricular band program. The WWSHS bands have won numerous music awards and students will find it a very rewarding experience. If a student is not yet enrolled in the curricular band for the fall, contact Mr. Scimeca at [vscimeca@cusd200.org](mailto:vscimeca@cusd200.org) as soon as possible.
- B. Color guard members may be accepted in the TMB without prior musical experience, subject to their level of dance expertise.
- C.
  - 1. No auditions are required to join the marching band.
  - 2. Auditions are required for the color guard.

## **3. Calendar of Events**

- A. A performance and rehearsal schedule for the TMB is provided so all members can make these dates and time a priority.
- B. The marching band calendar is subject to occasional changes during the year. Every effort will be made to give at least two weeks notice of any change. Please be flexible if changes occur during the season.
- C. The primary means of communicating changes will be email and posting on the TMB website. Please ensure that the TMB has your current email address. If you do not have email, please arrange to get copies of communications from another band member on a regular basis.
- D. From time to time, students may be requested to arrive earlier or remain later than the scheduled rehearsal times.
- E. Section leaders may schedule special rehearsals as needed for their respective sections to assist with marching and music. This is valuable time for more individualized attention. All TMB members should make these a priority.
- F. The TMB rehearses and performs under most weather conditions. Rehearsals are not canceled due to inclement weather. Students are expected to dress appropriately for the weather. In the event of unexpected weather changes, members are issued thermal raincoats which are extremely warm and protective. In case of lightning, torrential rain, extreme cold and extreme wind, practice will be moved indoors.

## **4. Attendance Policies**

To ensure the quality of the program and the safety of the students, band members are expected to attend all rehearsal and performances.

- A. Excused absences may include illness, death in the family, or sudden emergency. Notify director Mr. Madonia as soon as possible of any such absence at 784-7009, [mmadonia@cusd200.org](mailto:mmadonia@cusd200.org)
- B. Parents may request a scheduled absence from a practice by communicating with Mr. Madonia in advance. A decision as to whether the absence will be excused is at the discretion of the TMB Director.

- C. Students will not be excused from practice for homework, work, transportation, forgetfulness, non-school activities, or family travel without the express permission of the TMB director.
- D. Any anticipated conflict with a competition date on the schedule must be discussed with the TMB director immediately. There are few, if any, non-emergency reasons to not attend a competition. Family vacations or college visits are not valid reasons.
- E. To ensure the safety of other band members, the TMB director and staff, at their discretion, may remove any student from a performance for reasons of insufficient preparation or lack of attendance at rehearsals. Parents will be notified in advance of such removal.
- F. The individual student is responsible for making up any work missed during an absence. Absentees should schedule time with their section leaders or drum majors immediately upon their return.

## 5. Punctuality

- A. Start time means students are **in place on the field and ready to play**. In order to do this, each TMB member should arrive at least fifteen minutes prior to the established time and be in place for rehearsal five minutes early. If it takes a student additional time to be ready, then he/she needs to arrive at school earlier to prepare themselves for rehearsal. Excessive tardiness will be handled as an unexcused absence.
- B. End time is the time musical rehearsal ends. Members then attend an on field review of the rehearsal, gather all instruments, equipment and belongings and proceed back to the school where everything must be put away properly. This typically takes 15-20 minutes when all students participate.

## 6. Rehearsal Illness/Injury

Due to the incredible physical demand inherent in the marching band activity, some students may face athletic related illness or injuries. If a student feels it necessary to remove himself/herself from rehearsal to this type of difficulty, we will ask the student to call a parent or guardian and arrange to be picked up as soon as possible in order to receive the appropriate medical attention. Conditions such as asthma and muscle strains/sprains are some of the more common issues students face. Parents are best qualified to assess the specific needs in these situations. Each student should have a current emergency contact number on file where parents can be reached in case the need arises. Please be certain to contact us if up-dates need to be made to your student's medical information or if phone numbers have changed.

## 7. Athletics and Other Activities

Participation in the TMB precludes successful participation in a fall sport or other major extra curricular activity because of the intensity of the schedule. Members may participate in winter and spring sports or activities.

## 8. Attitude

Regardless of their ability, members who have a positive cooperative attitude coupled with a strong work ethic will always have a place in the TMB. Since teamwork is essential, those members with exceptional musical and marching ability will be expected to assist other students in addition to performing at their individual best. The TMB director has the discretion to withhold a student from performance for exhibiting a negative or uncooperative attitude. The TMB director may request a student to withdraw from the TMB in the case of repeated events of this nature.

## 9. Marching Band Camp

Each season the TMB holds a mandatory band camp at the school in August prior to the start of the school year. The 2007 season camp will be held August 13 thru 17. Members are expected to schedule vacations around marching band camp. In order to avoid scheduling conflicts, the exact dates and time of band camp

are published as early as possible in the second semester of the previous school year. Camp is held regardless of the weather, so please be sure students dress appropriately. Additional information about band camp will be distributed in early August.

## 10. Instrument Rental

- A. The use of certain district-owned instruments is included in the marching band fee; however, the fee does not cover the cost of maintenance or repair to any of the district-owned instruments. Any member using a school instrument or equipment will be held responsible for that equipment and its repair/replacement.
- B. Parents and students renting a district instrument for marching band use must sign an “Instrument Rental Agreement” before being issued the instrument. This includes all percussion students.
- C. Students should provide their own mouthpieces for rental instruments.
- D. Percussionists should provide their own sticks, general mallets, and stick bag. The marching band will provide bass drum and other specialty mallets. Percussionists will be responsible for replacement cost of school mallets.

## 11. Uniforms

- A. T-shirts to be worn during the Warrenville and Wheaton 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parades will be distributed at no cost to new band students at a rehearsal prior to the parade dates. Returning students who marched in these parades last year already have the parade t-shirt.
- B. Uniforms will be fitted and distributed to each TMB student during times to be established over the summer. Typically these fitting times are either right before or after scheduled practices. Students and parents will sign a form indicating receipt of a uniform and responsibility for keeping the uniform in good condition. Written instructions and tips for keeping the uniform looking sharp will be handed out at the time a uniform is checked out to your student.
- C. The TMB fee includes the use of a uniform for the year. Students are required to wear a black shirt and shorts under their uniform for ease of changing on buses before and after performances. These “blacks” and a uniform shoe are required to be purchased through the TMB for approximately \$50 at the time a uniform is issued to your student. This is a one time expense for new TMB students. Returning students, unless their sizes have changed, will use the same “blacks” and shoes for all four years.

## 12. Financial Obligations & Fund Raising

- A. The participation fee for the TMB is \$300.00, payable in two installments if preferred. A payment is due by June 8<sup>th</sup> (either the entire fee if paying in full, or a first payment of \$150.00 with the remainder due August 1<sup>st</sup>). Checks should be made payable to WWSHS Marching Band, and returned with this completed packet to our registration chairperson Susan Clark at 1340 S. Sumner, Wheaton, IL 60187. If you need to make arrangements for a payment plan, please contact Mary Burge (see contact information on back page of this handbook). If the participation fee presents a financial hardship for your family, please contact Phil Britton, Assistant Principal for Fine and Performing Arts (contact information on back page of handbook). Your contact with Mary or Phil will be held in strict confidence and will be met with understanding. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in the TMB because of financial considerations.
- B. A high quality program requires more money than is typically generated by District support and student fees. The balance is provided through fund raising activities. The TMB holds a series of car washes and a Holiday Pops concert along with smaller, effortless events such as “Shop ‘n’ Share” and a 50/50 raffle at home football games. Every TMB family is expected to participate in fund raising activities in order to cover their student’s fair share of the expenses. Parents may elect to make a cash contribution for certain fundraisers in lieu of participation.

### **13. Tiger Marching Band Parents Association**

All parents of registered TMB members are automatically part of the Tiger Marching Band Parents Association and have a vital role in helping our students reach their potential! Every parent can choose the exciting team with which they would like to serve. Sign up at the parent meetings or contact our volunteer coordinator Kathleen Herbach for more information!

### **14. Letters, Numbers, and Awards**

All members in good standing will earn class numerals or a letter for their participation in the TMB. Typically, numerals are given for the first year of participation and letters are awarded each succeeding year. It is an honor to wear letters and numerals on the school jacket.

### **15. School Rules: Eligibility/Code of Conduct**

The TMB will follow the established WWSHS and CUSD 200 academic eligibility and conduct policies, as described in the form included with this registration package. Please read this information carefully. Student grades will be monitored weekly to remedy problems as early as possible. TMB members are expected to sign and adhere to the code of conduct established by WWSHS and CUSD 200.

### **16. Physical Education Exemption**

All members of the competitive marching band, grades 9-12, are eligible to request a P.E. Exemption for the duration of the season (August-October). Students will need to see their counselor during the first week of school in order to file the appropriate form for the exemption. The form will need to be signed by a parent and the band director before the exemption will be granted.

### **17. WWSHS Forms & Fees**

Every form your student needs to complete in order to participate in the TMB (other than the Instrument Rental Agreement, to be completed later) is included in this packet. You will also receive a general school registration packet for your student from the high school. You do not need to re-submit the code of conduct and activity permission form, or medical information card to the school with that registration packet. A physical form is **not** required to participate in the TMB, but if your student is an incoming freshman, that state required physical should accompany their general school registration. Also, if your student will be participating in any athletics that require the IHSA physical form, you may return it with your general school registration or enclose that with your other TMB completed paperwork. The forms in this packet that you return to Susan Clark will be forwarded to the school on your behalf. You only need turn these forms in once to satisfy the requirements for any other athletics or activities your student may participate in during the year. There may, however, be other fees assessed for other school activities. Please note, however, that WWSHS and CUSD 200 require the completion of the TMB forms and payment of the TMB fee in order to be eligible to rehearse and perform. **Because many of our competitions are all day events where meals are provided through our TMB organization, it is important that you inform us on the enclosed yellow medical information card of any food or other allergies or medical conditions that apply to your student, including prescription medications.** Please make sure you turn in the required forms and fees promptly after receiving them tonight. We want every TMB member to be eligible to participate.

### **18. Travel**

Detailed information sheets, showing reporting, departing and estimated arrival times are distributed prior to any trip. Please arrange to have transportation available for your students at the designated estimated arrival

times. Students must return back to WWSHS with the TMB unless special circumstances require your student to return home with you. In this case, your student must present a signed travel release form to his/her assigned parent chaperone. This form can be found on the TMB website at [tigermb.com](http://tigermb.com)

## **19. Reclamation Fees**

Personal responsibility is of paramount importance for all TMB members. All students are responsible for their personal, school-owned or distributed items. Recovered items will be kept in the office. If a student wishes to claim an item, they may do so by paying a \$1.00 reclamation fee per item.

## **20. Code of Honor**

All TMB members have the privilege to represent WWSHS with pride. With this privilege comes individual accountability and responsibility to display conduct becoming of a mature young adult. Students should follow the directions of chaperones and staff at all times. There Shall BE NO Action for Which an Explanation is Necessary. (*Translation: If you think someone might ask you, "Why did you do that?", then don't do it.*)

## **21. Final Note**

Anything not specifically covered in this handbook will be addressed according to the District 200 extracurricular code of conduct.
